- (Consumer or citizen?)
- 1. Modern city: arbitrary and opportunistic
- 2. Horizontality: sprawl vs. urban density
- 3. Verticality: anthropocentric patterns and ecological imperatives = 'inhabitable multistory garden'
- 4. Zoning: picture a city that works + the imperative of the ground floor

Niels-Christian Fritsche

- a. Separate city and country: bye-bye, suburb
- b. Reconsider urban density: stack things up
- c. Recalculate time geography: public transport < 500 m
- d. Allow for collectivity and disarrangement
- e. Expect further mental changes (Neuro-Urbanism)
- f. Prepare for a bastard mix instead of typological cleanness (the imperative of the ground floor)
(+ Provide ubiquitous greenery: street, façade, roof ...)
